#### **5.1.4.** What are the specific support services / facilities available for:

#### (i) students from SC/ST, OBC and economically weaker sections:

The institution provides financial aid every year to its students who belong to SC/ST Ans: and OBC categories and are economically weak. This aid is in the form of scholarships, poor girls' fund and fee exemption at P.G. level. There is relaxation in percentage of marks and reservation in seats according to government policy at the time of admission. In 2011-12, BPL students received scholarship funded by U.G.C. Financial help is provided to extremely poor students who are earmarked and selected on the basis of the income certificates and other details provided by them. Some teachers personally help needy students from time to time by giving them financial aid and study materials etc.

#### (ii) students with physical disabilities:

At the time of admission, they are given concession in their cut-off percentage, they can come directly to the concerned teacher or staff instead of standing in long queues. Once the session starts, the college tries to focus on their physical and academic requirements.

#### (iii) **Overseas students:** Nil

#### students to participate in various competitions /national and international: (iv)

The teachers of the concerned departments support those students who participate in national competitions by giving guidance and counselling as and when required. They also accompany the teams or students for participation in programmes in other colleges or platforms. For instance, the games teacher accompanies her teams going out of Kanpur.

#### Medical Assistance to students: Health Centre, Health Insurance etc.: (**v**)

A Health and Hygiene Committee has been constituted by the Principal. This committee organises free health-camps and lectures etc. for the benefit of the students. The programmes and activities of this committee have already been enumerated in Criterion III. A First Aid-Box is also always available for any emergency. There is also a health-centre in the college with necessary infrastructure. Arrangements can be made for a doctor on call when required. The plan of providing health insurance to the students is on anvil.

#### Organizing coaching classes for competitive exams: (**vi**)

The institution facilitates and supports the students for appearing and qualifying in various competitive examinations. It ran coaching classes for entry into these competitive exams and services from 9<sup>th</sup> January 2012 to 16<sup>th</sup> March 2012 (details are given in O.no.5.1.7). The Guidance and Counselling Cell of the institution also organises such programmes for the students from time to time.

#### Skill Development (Spoken English, Computer Literacy etc.): (vii)

To develop such skills among the students, the institution runs many programmes from time to time. The Department of Sanskrit along with Uttar Pradesh Sanskrit Sansthan organised a ten days 'Sanskrit Sambhashan Programme' in 2012 for students to enhance their skill of Sanskrit-speaking. Many students participated in this programme. The institution, with the help of the teaching agency 'Y2K computers', successfully runs a fully-equipped computer-centre for 'O' level computer course.

This course is affiliated from C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur. Over 800 students have passed out from the college over the last 9 years. There are 8 to 10 computers in the centre. Each period is of 45 minutes of duration with theory and practical being taught everyday. After the completion of the course, the students get "O" level certificate. In 2010-11, 54 students were enrolled, 97 students got enrolled in 2012-13 and 76 in the year 2013-14.

#### (viii) <u>Support for slow learners</u>:

The institution has conducted remedial classes for slow-learners. The teachers also take surprise tests. Slow learners are given revision classes on the basis of the question pattern asked in previous years of the university examination. They are also provided with the necessary books and stationery.

#### (ix) <u>Exposures of students to other institutions of higher learning/corporate/</u> <u>business house etc.:</u>

The teachers always motivate the students to attend seminars, work-shops, symposiums and conferences organized by other colleges. The students get exposure for higher learning through internet which is enabled by Network Resource Centre (NRC) of the college established under U.G.C. XI Plan scheme.

Students are also motivated to attend cultural activities organized not only by other colleges but also by the university, district administration or corporate/business houses of the city. They have earned laurels by winning several prizes for the college.

The Dept. of sports also takes the college teams to tournaments organized by the institutions within or outside Kanpur city. There also the students have bagged prizes for themselves and the college.

The detailed list of all these achievements is provided in Q.nos. 5.3.1 and 5.3.2

#### (x) <u>Publication of students' magazine:</u>

The institution publishes a students' magazine named 'Pragati' every year. Students are motivated to write articles, poems or anecdotes etc. for this magazine. They write on such issues like environment, politics, yoga, health and hygiene, literature, economics etc. They can write in any of the three languages of English, Hindi or Sanskrit.

The college also publishes bi-annual newsletters highlighting the achievements of the college. This letter consists all of the activities of the college during one session.

## 5.1.5. Describe the efforts made by the institution to facilitate entrepreneurial skills, among the students and the impact of the efforts.

- Ans.
  - To encourage and develop entrepreneurial skills in the students, the institution organises various programmes. On 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2011 a programme entitled 'Women Entrepreneurship Development Programme' was organised by the Department of Home Science in collaboration with National Research Development Corporation, New Delhi. The Chief Guest on this occasion was Smt. Rama Rani Tripathi (Manager National Research Development Corporation) and the speakers were Sri R.A. Yadav, General Manager, District Industry Centre, Kanpur, Sri A.K. Singh, Asst. Manager, (District Industry Centre, Kanpur), Sri Vinod Kumar and Ms. Shweta Bhatnagar (NGO, Sri Sevashram Gram Utthan Samiti, Muzaffarnagar). One of the ex-students of the college and the current owner of a restaurant in the city Mrs. Shilpi Mehrotra was also invited to share her thoughts and experiences with the

students on her journey to becoming a successful business-woman. She was also honoured for her efforts in the field of entrepreneurship. Participating students were given stationery and certificates by NRDC, New Delhi.

- The 'Equal Opportunity Centre' has also worked to create the spirit of entrepreneurship in the students. It organised 'Women Entrepreneurship Camp' from 10<sup>th</sup> December 2011 to 13<sup>th</sup> December 2011 in which the students were trained in tailoring, embroidery, soft toy-making, flower-making, bag-making, quilting etc.
- On 18<sup>th</sup> February 2012, the college organised a lecture of Smt. Neelam Chaturvedi, General Secretary of the NGO, 'Sakhi Kendra- Mahila Manch' who told the students about the various schemes, plans and policies of the of the Government to boost women entrepreneurship. The various articles prepared by the students from time-to-time were put on display for exhibition-cum-sale on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2012 in which many people purchased these articles. A five days course of textile printing was successfully organised by this cell from 18<sup>th</sup> December 2013 to 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2013. Thus, this Cell is creating awareness among students to use their skills for entrepreneurial purposes and providing a new vision on the relationship between education and entrepreneurship for the welfare of the students.
- Dr. Jyoti Agnihotri from the Department of Drawing and Painting also trained the students in the art of making terracotta beads and jewellery and then organized an exhibition cum sale in November 2010 of the artworks prepared by the students.
- The Department of Home Science also organized an exhibition cum sale in February 2010 of the hand-made goods prepared by the students of that department. From 10<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> December 2014, this department trained students to make various useful articles by waste materials with the help of Pidilite Company. Every year on the occasion of Diwali, the college organises exhibitions cum sale of several hand-made 'Diyas' and other decorative items made by the students of the institution. The sale of these items greatly encouraged the entrepreneurial spirit among the students.
- On 30<sup>th</sup> August 2013, a career awareness programme on 'How to convert education into Money' was organised by Sanskar Society under the banner of Guidance and Counselling Cell which provided important tips to students on self-empowerment and self-dependence.
- In the month of September 2013 and on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2014, Jaipuria Institute of Management organised an awareness seminar on management studies. The delegates focused on the latest knowhow of management, vocational skills and attitudes and gave professional guidelines to students.

# 5.1.6. Enumerate the policies and strategies of the institution which promote participation of students in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities such as sports, games, quiz-competitions, debates and discussions, cultural activities etc.

#### Ans: Additional academic support, flexibility in examinations:

There is no flexibility in examinations for the students who are participating in extracurricular and co-curricular activities. The conduction of examinations is solely the prerogative of the university and there is no such provision in its rule-book.

#### Special dietary requirements, sports uniform and material:

The Dept. of Physical Education does provide dietary supplements to the students after their practices. It also provides them the sports uniform and sports material during practice and participation of their respective sports. Thus, the department has provided things like jogging shoes, badminton shoes, racquets, shuttle-cocks, football boots, football, handball, volleyball, sports-kit etc. to its students. The institution takes the responsibility of their TA and other requirements when they go for any

tournament. The institution also provides these facilities to those students who participate in cultural activities through Students Union Committee.

- 5.1.7. Enumerating on the support and guidance provided to the students in preparing for the competitive exams, give details on the number of students who appeared and qualified in various competitive exams such as UGC-CSIR-NET, UGC NET, SLET, ATE/CAT/GRE/TOFEL/GMAT/Central/State Services, Defence, Civil Services etc.
- Ans: From 9<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> January 2012, the institution ran coaching classes for entry into services. These classes were financed by the grant of Rs. 4 lakhs by UGC under its XI<sup>th</sup> Plan. Apart from other services, these classes were particularly for NET, TET, Banking, and LTT. The classes were for SC/ST, OBC and minority students. 80 students of OBC and minority community and 20 students of SC community availed these classes. The resource persons appointed for these classes were:

Each resource person was allotted 32 lectures and was paid the sum of Rs. 16,000/-.

On 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2013, 'Vivekanand Youth Wing' an NGO organised a written test on the pattern of Bank Clerical, LDC, UDC, SSC exams. 50 students were selected for three month class-room study and preparation for competitive services. This programme was organised under the banner of Guidance and Counselling Cell of the college.

The number of students who appeared and qualified these competitive exams could not be ascertained as once the classes were over, no one reported about their future plans or achievements.

## 5.1.8. What type of counselling services are made available to the students (academic, personal, career, psycho-social etc.).

- Ans: The institution provides many types of counselling services to students. During the academic year:
  - The Admission Committee of the college, apart from looking after the admission, is also assigned the task of counselling the new-comers about the best possible combination of subjects they could opt at under-graduate level. This is done on the basis of their pass percentage in intermediate exams, future plans about their career and various competitive exams after U.G. and P.G. courses.
  - The Grievance Redressal Cell of the students has worked to solve the personal problems of students and counselled them on several personal issues. The on-the-campus problems like loss of identity card or green slip, unavailability of books

from the library, lack of finances to buy books, loss of personal money in the college campus etc. are tended to and solved by the convener of Grievance Redressal Cell, Smt. Suman Pandey. Sushma Prajapati, the student of M.A. I in the self-finance course of Home Science was too poor to pay the full fee of her course. The Cell had her fee redempted. Many such other problems of personal or academic nature have been solved by the Cell. Several teachers and faculty members of the college also counsel and help the students financially and academically by giving their fees and books etc. at personal level. Km. Sujeeta Jha, the student of B.A. first year was facing some financial and domestic problems, which were handled by Dr. Chandni Saxena, Asst. Professor, Dept. of History, at personal level.

- The Principal, at the beginning of the session, personally instructs the faculty members and office-bearers to be available to the students as and when required by them. The students, if they have any query or problem, can approach any teacher or office bearer at any time of the college. They do their best to offer solutions to their problems.
- The Guidance and Counselling and Cell has not only organized programmes which have helped the students to choose their line of profession in future but has also guided them about the necessary academic preparations required for their chosen field.
- 5.1.9. Does the institution have a structured mechanism for career guidance and placement of its students? If yes, detail on the services provided to help students to identify job opportunities and prepare themselves for interview and the percentage of students selected during campus interviews by different employers (list the employers and the programmes).
- Ans: The college has 'Guidance, Counselling and Placement Cell' and Dr. Alpana Rai is the convener of this Cell. With its permission, various Companies and recruitmentagencies organize seminars, meets, talk-shows and other interactive-sessions and activities with a view to provide counselling services to the students. The activities of the Cell from 2006-07 to 2011-12 have already been sent in AQARs. During 2012-13 to 2014-15, it major activities have been as under:

#### September 2012

Vivekanand Youth Wing (an NGO) organized a seminar on the methods of preparing for such competitive exams like Bank clerical, PO, SSC, LDC and UDC exams. They also organized an examination to know the level of students' preparation and selected 50 students from the college for free class-room study for three months.

#### October 2012

On 31<sup>st</sup> October 2012, Maya Academic of Advance Cinematics organised an awareness seminar on bachelor's degree in animation, affiliated to IGNOU.

#### November 2012

On 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> November 2012, Maya Academic of Advance Cinematics organised a Photoshop workshop for the students under the banner of Guidance and Counselling Cell.

#### December 2012

On 20<sup>th</sup> December 2012, Krishna Girls Engineering College/Krishna Institute of Technology organised a seminar on career awareness and personality development.

#### January 2013

On 18<sup>th</sup> January 2013, Windows 8 students' conclave by Microsoft organised an awareness programme in which students were given valuable tips to make themselves more viable in terms of technology and competence.

#### July 2013

From 23<sup>rd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> July 2013, Franklin College of Management and Vocational Studies set-up a canopy in the college campus to tell the students about the courses like B.A. in Aviation, Hospitality, Travel, Tourism and Customer services.

#### August 2013

On 30<sup>th</sup> August 2013, a Career Awareness programme about 'How to convert Education into Money' was organized by Sanskar Society, an NGO.

#### September 2013

On 10<sup>th</sup> September 2013, a workshop was organised by DXN on the topic 'War against Malnutrition' in which DXN consultant Mr. Hardeep Singh delivered a lecture on our food habits and food-supplements.

Jaipuria Institute of Management organised an awareness seminar on management studies. The delegates focused on communication skills and attitude for success.

#### December 2013

On 5<sup>th</sup> December 2013, a drawing competition and an awareness programme was organised by MAAC on the topics 'Environmental Awareness' and 'Female Infanticide' in which 75 students participated. MAAC executive Mr. Surya supervised the whole event and 3 best students were given gold, silver and bronze medals by the Company.

#### September 2014

On 26<sup>th</sup> September 2014, a seminar was organised by the Cell under the aegis of Mahindra Education to tell the students about such competitive examinations like banks, LIC etc.

#### December 2014

On 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2014, the Cell conducted a programme on 'Utilities and Positivities of Distance Education' in collaboration with distance education study centre. AAI Deemed University, Allahabad to create awareness among students for the distance education.

From 9<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> December 2014, the Cell organised a programme on computer education and took a test of CCC Aptitude. To encourage the students for computer literacy, scholarships were also provided to selected students.

### 5.1.10 Does the institution have a student Grievance Redressal Cell? If yes, list (if any) the grievances reported and redressed during the last four years.

- Ans: Yes, the institution has two Grievance Redressal Cells:
  - (a) For employees
  - (b) For students

#### **Functions of Grievance Redressal Cell:**

- To register any complaint of harassment submitted in writing by any students or working employee of the institution.
- To put-up and discuss the complaint with the duly constituted committee or authority.
- To arrange for suitable suggestive procedures and measures with the appropriate authority to resolve and redress the complaint lodged by the complainant.

#### Major Grievances of students redressed during the last four years:

Most of the grievances reported by the students in their applications have been related to the loss of identity cards or green slips, poor financial condition and request of financial help, arrangement of furniture in the classrooms, difficulties related to the library and some personal and family problems. The Committee, in order to resolve these problems, approached the appropriate centres of authority which could look into the respective matters. The girls who had lost their identity cards or green slips were helped by issuing new I. cards or green slips by the office. Some students reported that their subjects in the admit cards of their examinations were wrong. The committee contacted the university for corrective measures. Some students of M.A. (Home Science) who were too poor to pay their fees had, on the instructions of the committee and then of principal, had some percentage of their fee redempted. Those whose personal belongings were stolen in the college premises reported their loss to the Cell. They were not only helped in recovering their stolen goods but the girls who had helped in the recovery were appropriately rewarded for their efforts. The Cell has also been imparting necessary instructions to the electricians, plumbers or peons for grievances related to water, electricity or cleanliness within the premises.

## 5.1.11. What are the institutional provisions for resolving issues pertaining to sexual harassment?

- Ans: The 'Women Harassment Cell' is working to solve and redress any problem or complaint registered by the women employees or students of the institution for any harassment inside the college campus. The functions of the Cell are:
  - To register any complaint of harassment submitted by any working women employees or bonafide students of the college.
  - To put-up and discuss the complaint with the duly constituted committee or authority.
  - To arrange for suitable suggestive procedures and measures with the appropriate authority to resolve and redress the complaint lodged by the complainant.
  - To organize, conduct and execute programmes to create awareness and enlighten the women of the institution to redress and resolve women harassment/atrocities anywhere.

#### **Activities of Women Harassment Cell**

• Due to ever increasing incidents of women harassment in the city, this Cell organised a rally in collaboration with an NGO named 'Mahila Manch – Sakhi Kendra' Kanpur and tied 'Rakhis' to the male employees of the institution and the adjoining areas- a small but effective gesture to spread and rekindle the brotherly feeling to curb women harassment. A 'Mahila Manch – Sakhi Kendra' in collaboration with 'Equal Opportunity Centre' of the college was launched.

- A programme of 'Women's Parliament' was organised in the institution to create awareness towards right of voting and rights of women in March 2012. A printed pamphlet entitled 'Laws Protecting the Women's Harassment' was distributed among the staff and students to create awareness about the existing legal remedies in this regards.
- In 2012-13, a complaint by one of Lab-Assistant Mrs. Mridula Tripathi of the college was lodged in the Cell which has been expedited to her satisfaction.

## 5.1.12. Is there an anti-ragging committee? How many instances (if any) have been reported during the last four years and what action has been taken on them?

Ans: Yes, there is an Anti-ragging Committee in the institution. All the committee members remain active throughout the year to prevent ragging in campus. That is why no incident or complaint has been reported by students to Committee members.

#### 5.1.13. Enumerate the welfare schemes made available to the students by the institution.

Ans: There are only a few specific schemes for student welfare. The college runs 'Students Guidance and Counselling Cell' (details provided in question no. 5.1.9) and has run several courses under the aegis of 'Equal Opportunity Centre' to enhance the entrepreneurial skills of the students which have really helped them to earn while they learn (detail given in question no. 5.1.5). The guest lectures have also been organised to keep the students informed about the latest developments and researches made in their subjects. The college is planning to provide insurance to the students in near future.

# 5.1.14. Does the institution have a registered Alumni Association? If yes, what are its activities and major contribution for institutional, academic and infrastructural development?

- Ans: Yes, the institution has an Alumni Association which was formed in 1989. Since then many activities have been performed by this Association. These are:
  - There was an annual meet of Alumni Association on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2011. On this occasion, Dr. Vishwaprabha Sharma, the Ex-H.O.D. of Education, gave away the sum of Rs. 1000/- as motivation to two students of the college Km. Padamashree Bajpai and Km. Nidhi Verma. Moreover, the ex-students and the present faculty of the college, Dr. Niranjana Shukla and Dr. Mridula Rawal gave silver medals to the following students:

• Dr. Mridula Rawal, the ex-student of the college and the former H.O.D. of Education donated Rs. 50,000/- to the Alumni Association for the welfare of the students. This amount was utilized to purchase white boards for the college. Dr. Vishwaprabha Sharma, donated Rs. 10,000/- to the college.

A lecture series was organised by Alumni Association from 15<sup>th</sup> December 2013 to 24<sup>th</sup> December 2013 to inspire the students. The lectures were delivered by Dr. Sangeeta Saxena (ex-student and presently the Associate Professor in D.G. College, Kanpur), Dr. Nirupama Dixit (ex-student and Ex-H.O.D. of Psychology in S.N. Sen P.G. College, Kanpur), Dr. Mridula Rawal (ex-student and Ex-H.O.D. of Education in Juhari Devi Girls P.G. College, Kanpur), Smt. Shilpi Mehrotra (ex-student and owner of a Restaurant in Kanpur), Ms. Aarti Chauhan (ex-student and freelance artist from the Department of Drawing and Painting, Juhari Devi Girls P.G. College, Kanpur), Ms. Saraswati Mishra (ex-student, recipient of J.R.F. and faculty member in a selffinance College in Kanpur) and Ms. Shraddha Chaurasia (ex-student and lecturer in an Inter College, Kanpur).

#### **Student Progression**

#### 5.2.1. Providing the percentage of students progressing to higher education or employment (for the last four batches), highlight the trends observed.

There are thirteen departments presently running in the college. Of them, six are post-Ans: graduate and seven are under-graduate departments. Of the six P.G. Departments, one (Home Science) runs under self-finance scheme for which an entrance exam is conducted by the university for admission. The selected students are assigned to the college by the university itself. These selected students can be outsiders as well as students who did their U.G. (with Home Science as one of their subjects) from the college itself. All sixty seats assigned to the college are filled by the university. It is therefore, not possible to calculate the exact percentage of students who progress from U.G. to P.G. within the college to study P.G. in Home Science.

In the remaining five departments, the total number of seats allotted to each P.G. course is sixty. But these sixty seats are also open to the outsiders. The admission is done on the basis of merit. Moreover, the U.G. subjects of Sociology and Education, which attract maximum number of students in B.A. do not have P.G. in the college. Therefore, the students who seek P.G. in these two subjects are forced to do so from some other college. To sum up, on an average, only about 25% students graduating from the college go for P.G. programme in our college.

Since the results of MA (Music) of the year 2014-15 had been sent by the university till the time of the submission of the report, the above data excludes the same. Moreover, it is not possible to give a comparative data of the results of other institutions affiliated to the university as the college does not and cannot have access to the same.

## 5.2.3. How does the institution facilitate student progression to higher level of education and/or towards employment?

Ans: The institution facilitates student progression to higher level of education through its Guidance, Counselling and Placement Cell. It takes into account their subjects at U.G. and P.G. level, their areas of interest, their aptitudes and their choices. Through its several seminars, meets and talks, the Cell then suggests the appropriate jobs to the students. The teachers also provide counselling to the students as they are in regular touch with their performances and abilities to progress to higher levels of education or towards employment. But it is very difficult to maintain the records of the students who are employed after finishing their courses from the college. They rarely ever report their employment status in the college. There are mostly Under-graduate Departments in the college and the students, before seeking employment, prefer to do post-graduation. Since they do their P.G. from other colleges, they rarely ever report back in our institution after being employed.

## 5.2.4. Enumerate the special support provided to students who are at the risk of failure and dropout?

Ans:

- The faculty tries to finish the course of every subject on time so that the regular students do not miss any topic of their subjects.
- For students who are weak in academics, the college has run remedial/coaching classes.
- The teachers are personally available to the students to answer their queries regarding their academic programme.
- There are interactive sessions also in which the students try to seek the solutions and answers to their curricular problems.
- Through Students Redressal Cell also students are encourage to come out with their academic problems. Their queries are then sought to be answered.
- Programmes on women empowerment are also organised to educate the students about the importance of education.
- Parents-teachers Association also encourages the parents to inspire their wards to pursue further studies.
- Extra classes and revision classes are conducted to finish the course on time. Teachers try to revise the syllabus before the examinations start.
- The college has started Network Resource Centre to facilitate the students in their studies.
- All the necessary informations regarding the submission of examination forms, dates of practical examinations or the schedules of annual exams are conveyed to the students well before time. There have been occasions when, despite the best of efforts by the institution, some students failed to receive the dates of practical examination. The institution has ensured to inform the absent students about the examination date at their door steps.

### 5.1.5. List the range of sports, games, cultural and other extracurricular activities available to students. Provide details of participation and programme calendar.

Ans: The college is particularly known for its active participation in sports and games at inter-college, inter-state and national level activities. To facilitate the students' participation in games and sports, there is full-fledged Sports Department in the college under Smt. Seema Ghosh who personally takes the college teams to places of competitions and programmes at district, state and national levels. Annual sports of the college are held every year. In 2014-15, the 47<sup>th</sup> College Annual Sports day was organised.

# 5.3.3. How does the college seek and use data and feedback from its graduates and employers, to improve the performance and quality of the institutional provisions?

- Ans: The institution has developed its own format to seek the feedback from the students. This feedback is taken from both the under-graduate as well as post-graduate students. It is taken on the following parameters:
  - Feedback on curriculum
  - Feedback on the teachers
  - Feedback on programmes and teaching
  - Feedback on infrastructural basic facilities

Since these parameters include feedback about the institution, it definitely is used positively for the growth and development of the college. For instance, the graduates of the college were constantly showing desire for the up-gradation of the college infrastructure--particularly the renovation of the building. As a result, the Board of Management undertook several measures to satisfy their demands, added furniture, CCTV cameras, Public Announcement System, regular white-washing, improvements in washrooms etc. This work is continuously going on since 2010.

To seek data and feedback from the employers, regular meetings and consultations with all the stakeholders take place which add to the growth and development of the institution. Moreover, the different academic and administrative committees also collect data and feedback in their respective areas from the students as-well-as employees.

# 5.3.4. How does the college involve and encourage students to publish materials like catalogues, wall magazines, college magazines and other materials? List the publications / materials brought out by the students during the previous four academic sessions.

Ans: The college publishes the college magazine almost every year in which the college invites articles, poems or other such creative writing by the students in English, Hindi and Sanskrit. During the academic session of 2011-12 and 2012-13, the college published the magazine in which 26 poems and articles in Hindi, 5 in English and 13 in Sanskrit were contributed by the students. For the sessions 2013-14 and 2014-15, this magazine is going to be published in this session. There is also a good contribution of students for publishing different type of materials. These students are a part of the editorial board of this magazine. They participate in the collections of articles, editing, proof-reading and other related works of magazine publication.

### 5.3.5. Does the college have a student council or any similar body? Give details on its selection, constitution, activities and funding.

Ans: Yes, the college has a student council named 'JAGRITI'.
