3.1.3. What are the measures taken by the institution to facilitate smooth progress and implementation of research schemes/projects?

Ans: **Autonomy to the principal investigator**: The Principal investigator of any research project is given full autonomy by the institution to adopt whatever line, hypothesis or methodology of investigation she finds necessary or suitable for her research work.

Timely availability or release of resources: The Principal as well as the office of the institution ensures that there is timely release of whatever resources required by the investigator so that the latter does not face any problems in the course of her work. If there is any discrepancy in the amount sanctioned by the funding agency and the amount received by the investigator, it is due to the fact that the funding agency itself has not sent the amount and the college has nothing to do with the matter.

Adequate infrastructure and the human resources: Whatever resources are required by the investigator regarding her research, which are available in the institution, are provided to her. Library resources, internet facility with broadband, or any other technological requirements are tried to be fulfilled.

Time-off, reduced teaching load, special leave etc. to teachers: Due to the strict time schedule and sometimes the paucity of teaching staff, the teachers including the chief investigator need to take their regular classes. But if required and adjustments made, the teaching load is sometimes shared by other departmental members. However, the principal, on her discretion, sanctions special leave as and when required.

Support in terms of technology and information needs: The college has developed a technology room which is fully equipped with computers, printers, scanners, broad-band facilities etc. which can be used by any investigator whenever the need arises. The library caters to all the necessary information needs.

Facilitate timely auditing and submission of utilization certificate to the funding authority: The Staff has not displayed any grievances on the matter.

3.1.4. What are the efforts made by the institution in developing scientific temper and research culture and aptitude among students.

Ans: The institution tries its best to create research culture and aptitude among its students. There is a technology lab in the college with several desktop computers having internet facilities. Although the university has not taken any admission in P.hd since 2008, the students who were enrolled before that and have been researching on their topics or the ones who have undertaken dissertation work in M.A. Final are encouraged to consult their research related topics on internet as much as possible. The college library has rich collection of reference books on all subjects. The students are motivated by the teaching staff to consult these sources in the library. The library staff helps by its reprographic facilities. A wide range of websites are also suggested by the staff on the respective topics of the students.

The P.G. Departments of the college have one paper of dissertation/project work. The students are helped and guided by the teachers of the respective departments to prepare their dissertations/project work.

Last but not the least, the teachers from the departments of Social Sciences also keep informing the students about techniques and methodologies of Research.

3.2. Resource mobilization for research

3.2.1. What percentage of total budget is earmarked for research? Give details of major heads of expenditure, financial allocation and actual utilization.

Ans: The institutional budget does not earmark any amount of money for research work. But yes, the amount generated through internal resources like money collected in the form of registration fees of seminars and workshops is definitely utilized to boost up the research environment in the college. The maximum funds are utilized to update the library with the latest books and journals, to provide internet facilities to those who want to browse internet for research work and for other research related works. The Principal as well as IQAC are constantly urging teachers to submit Minor/Major Research Project proposals to U.G.C. and other such funding agencies. She, as well as the Management, without any delay, forward these proposals to the respective agency. There is one PDA Scholar pursuing Post-Doctoral Research under Retd. Head, Department of Home-Science financed by U.G.C. The college provides to her as many facilities as required for the purpose.

Ans: Students are not provided with any financial assistance for their research projects but nonetheless they are given all the other required help which they ask for or need from time-to-time. This help has already been enumerated in previous questions.

Ans: The university has not given any Ph.d admission since 2008. The students who opt for dissertation in M.A. are encouraged to take interdisciplinary topics. The faculty members have also taken up interdisciplinary topics for their Major/Minor Research Projects. For instance, Dr. Geeta Mathur, Head, Dept. of Home-Science has researched on the topic 'Study of Social Aspect of Food and its Nutritional importance' in her MRP. These are some of the interdisciplinary topics on which the students have researched for their dissertations. Almost all the units of the college have contributed in the conduction of these works. The library has forwarded not only the relevant books but also the journals and periodicals required for the work. The library staff has also downloaded the necessary materials from the internet to help the research scholars.

The departmental heads of different subjects have also forwarded all the necessary help which they could. They have provided conceptual as well as theoretical knowledge to the scholars. Whenever required, the teachers have forwarded books from

their personal collection too. They have directed the students to other libraries and sites where they could get materials. They have also guided them about the reference books which contain the necessary information.

3.2.5. How does the institution ensure optimal use of various equipment and research facilities of the institution by its staff and students?

Ans:

- The college library is open for research scholars from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm and the students are encouraged to consult the necessary research resources.
- The library staff subscribes latest journals and periodicals for research purposes.
- Large number of reference books of every subject are bought every year by the library for research work.
- The institution has broadband facility to download, upload, retrieve, search and store the necessary research material.
- The college has a technology room which has all the technological facilities required by the research scholars.
- The teaching staff readily provides any guidance required by the research scholars on any topic.
- The institution ensures optimal use of photo-copy machine, LCD and OHP.

Ans: No, the institution has not received any such grant.

3.6 Extention Activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

3.6.1. How does the institution promote institution-neighborhood-cummunity network and student engagement, contributing to good citizenship, service orientation and holistic development of students?

Ans: Our institution is committed to community services through various extension activities. The skills and knowledge acquired through teaching and research are utilized by faculty and students for the benefit of the society through several extension services. They are meant to create awareness and spread knowledge in the society (especially in college neighborhood) to improve its quality of living so as to eradicate superstitions, unhygienic style of living, ill-effect of drugs and alcoholism, corruption and environmental destruction which are hazardeous to mankind. These community services are an effective instrument to establish connections and linkages between the institution (faculty and students) and the society surrounding it. The activities of community services have already been enumerated in the previous AQARs and will also be discussed later in this report.

3.6.2 What is the institutional mechanism to track students' involvement in various social movements / activities which promote citizenship role?

Ans:

- Student union 'Jagriti' which is under the incharge-ship of any one of the teaching staff members, is the most effective tool to track students' involvement in social movements or activities. The teacher-in-charge decides the students who are required to be involved in such programmes not only within the college but also outside it. She keeps all the necessary records of all such programmes.
- There are several such committees within the administrative set-up of the college which keep track of such activities and the students' involvement in them. These committees are:
 - a) Committee of Health and Hygiene
 - b) Committee of Community and Social Development and Environmental awareness.
 - c) Committee of Civil Defense etc.
- The heads and staff members of the different departments also keep record of their students and their involvement in social activities.
- The NSS unit of the college also keeps such records of the students.

3.6.3. How does the institution solicit stakeholders' perception on the overall performance and quality of the institution?

Ans: To solicit the stakeholders' perception on the overall performance and quality of the institution,

- There are regular meetings between the Secretary, Board of Management, Principal and the teaching and non-teaching staff of the college.
- There are internal meetings between the Principal and Apex Committee of the college.
- The various committees conduct their programmes, prepare reports and present their reports for the review before the Principal.
- There are annual meetings between the Principal and Board of Management wherein the former presents the record of academic and non-academic activities and achievements of the college and discuss the future plan of action. Every third year there is a general body meeting to exchange the feedback.
- The Principal is in regular touch with the students and invite their views regarding the enhancement of the overall performance and quality of the institution.
- Parent-teacher meetings are also helpful in soliciting the parents' perception on the overall academic, cultural and sports performance and quality of the institution.

3.6.4. How does the institution plan and organize its extension and outreach programmes? Provide the budgetary details for the last four years, list the major extension and outreach programmes and their impact on the overall development of the students.

Ans: At the beginning of the session, the heads of the departments, conveners of different committees, conveners of Students Union and NSS and others chalk-out an outline of the agendas, programmes and activities along with their probable dates to be undertaken in

the coming session. They also decide the experts or resource persons to be invited on such occasions. An academic calendar is made for the purpose. The Principal and IQAC are provided with the details of all such programmes which are conducted on the pre-decided dates. Required changes are done in the programmes as and when the necessity arises.

The college has, in its budget, the provision of two funds through which it meets out the expenditure of all such extension and outreach programmes: Students Welfare Fund and Parishad Fund. The convener of the committee/department or incharge, student union/ NSS provide a detailed list of all the expenses to be undertaken for the conduction of the programme to the Principal and the latter, after the scrutiny of the list, sanctions the amount required. This amount varies from program to program.

3.6.5. How does the institution promote the participation of students and faculty in extension activities including participation in NSS, NCC, YRC and other national/international agencies?

Ans: The institution has NSS unit since 2012. Dr. Kalpana Gaur is the incharge of NSS since its inception. The NCC unit existed in the institution till 2011-12. The last incharge of NCC unit was Dr. Ranju Kushwaha.

In order to encourage the students, following steps are taken by the institution to motivate them to participate in extension activities:

- The Principal has constituted committees of faculty members including committees of NCC, NSS, and Civil Defence etc. A number of teachers are part of these committees who ensure not only the smooth functioning of such extension work but also encourage students to participate in them.
- The informations regarding extension activities are disseminated in daily assembly and the students are exhorted to be part of these activities.
- Written information is also displayed on notice boards to describe everything regarding such activities to the students.
- Regular meetings of the students with the incharges of these activities are also held. They tell the students about the benefits they can derive from them.
- The Departments of the college also share this responsibility.
- The incharges and their committee members sometimes have to go from class-to-class to tell the students about any forthcoming extension activity.

3.6.6. Give details of social surveys, research or extension work (if any) undertaken by the college to ensure social equality and empower students from under-privileged and vulnerable sections of society.

Ans: The NSS unit established in 2012-13 under Dr. Kalpana Gaur has undertaken various extension activities in and around the college:

- The plantation programme was organized in the college compound on 3rd September 2013. The chief-guest on the occasion was Dr. A.K. Mishra (Co-ordinator, NSS, CSJMU, Kanpur).

- On 24th September 2013, NSS day was celebrated in which NSS students were informed about the principles and values of NSS-love, peace, simplicity, non-violence etc.
- A seminar was organized by the students of NSS on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti. The volunteers of the unit depicted his principles and values through photo-exhibition.
- NSS unit of the college participated in the road rally organized by U.P. State AIDS Control Society on 12th August 2013 (International Youth Day).
- To create awareness among the college students, a seven days camp (from 23rd October, 2013) was organized in the college. The purpose of the camp was to register new voters and the process to make their voter ID cards was followed. Again from 18th December 2014, a three days camp was organized for the same purpose.
- An awareness seminar on HIV / AIDS was organized by District Tuberculosis Officer on 31st October, 2013 in which 25 volunteers of NSS unit participated.
- On 14th August 2014, the college NSS unit planted 100 trees in the premises of National Sugar Institute, Kanpur.
- On 30th September 2014, the students of NSS painted the wall in Cantonment area (Kataharibagh) and wrote messages, slogans and posters on the wall.
- On 5th October 2014, the students of NSS organized an exhibition and discussion on the life and values of Mahatma Gandhi.
- On 9th October 2014, around 75 to 80 students participated in Voters' Awareness Rally organized by the Government of India.
- From 21st to 31st October 2014, the college observed Book Donation Month in which debates, rallies and other such activities were organized.
- On 30th December 2014, the students of NSS organized a rally and poster exhibition to create awareness about the political and civil rights among the people living in the areas around the college.

NCC is a voluntary scheme incorporated with academics. It was registered under 17 UP Girls' Battalion, NCC in Kanpur in 1973-74. In our college, 160 cadets were enrolled in 2008 under the Commanding-Officer, Lt. Col. N.K. Parashar, Administrative Officer, Lt. Aditi Singh and A.N.O. Dr. Meena Singh Gaur (Sr. Lecturer, Department of Hindi, Juhari Devi College). First camp was organized from 1st January 2008 to 13th January 2008 and second camp was organized from 1st June 2008 to 10th June 2008. The cadets of the college secured first position in different competitions. Third camp was organized from 15th October 2008 to 25th October 2008 in which the college cadets again secured first position in different competitions. 122 cadets were able to get 'B' certificate. Out of these, 90 applied for 'C' certificate. 80 cadets participated in parade at police-line on 26th January 2009.

In 2009, 103 students were enrolled in NCC under the Commanding Officer, Lt. B. Kumar, Administrative Officer, Lt. Neelima Gaur and A.N.O. Dr. Ranju Kushwaha (Sr. Lecturer, Dept. of Home Science, Juhari Devi College). First camp was organized from 8th November 2009 to 17th November 2009 at long-range area, Cantonment, Kanpur in which 73 cadets were enrolled. They won a trophy for honesty. Second camp witnessed the enrollment of 30 cadets. In both these training camps, the cadets bagged prizes in various cultural programmes, debates and other competitions.

The Equal Opportunity Centre under UGC merged scheme has established a Mahila Helpline in collaboration with a local NGO called 'Sakhi-Kendra', Kanpur. A day before Raksha Bandhan festival in 2010, the girl students tied Rakhi to make brothers in and

around the vicinity of the campus. The concept was to inculcate the feeling of brotherhood for girls mainly to curb crimes against them by boys. The centre also organized a five day course on textile printing from 18th December 2013 to 23rd December 2013 to enable the students to become self-employed individuals. It also organized a ten day self-defence training programme from 10th February 2014 to 21st February 2014 to develop physical strength of the students. Again, from 10th February 2015 to 19th February 2015, the college, under the aegis of Rotary Club of New Kanpur and Inner Wheel Club of Kanpur East, organized a training programme of self-defence to make the girls capable of defending themselves in difficult situations. On 8th September 2014, an NGO named Red Brigade organized a self-defence training programme in Reserve Police Line, Kanpur in which 43 students of the college were given self-defence training.

The Committee of Adult Education and the Committee of Environmental Awareness have been formed in the college with the objective to help people living below poverty-line in slum areas, to improve their standards of living and to enhance their social acceptability. They carry-out literacy programmes for them through which they are taught importance of education, health and hygiene, ill-effects of drugs, alcoholism, tobacco-chewing, superstitions and social evils. They also arrange lecture series in the nearby slum areas (Parao ki Basti) with the aim of 'Each One-Teach One' and 'Each One-Plant One'. Every year, students of B.A. III teach over 100 adults under this campaign. Annual meet is held every year by this Committee in which these adults are felicitated by giving them kits and certificates of excellence.

Apart from this, the lower economic classes are also trained in such vocational skills like sculpture, carpentry, mehndi, playing dholak, making papad, chips, pickles, doing crochet work, knitting, stitching etc.

These committees jointly organized a poster exhibition in which the students displayed posters and slogans depicting low literacy among women, harmful effects of pollution, measures taken to save environment and how to maintain ecological balance and thereby avoid ill-effects of global warming.

The Adult Education Programme 'Each One-Teach One' is the brainchild of Education Department and has a glorious history of almost 25 years. The students' participation in the programme is quite encouraging and the participants as well as the beneficiaries are awarded at the end of each academic session.

3.6.7. Reflecting on objectives and expected outcomes of the extension activities organized by the institution, comment on how they complement students' academic learning experience and specify the values and skills inculcated.

Ans: The objectives of the extension activities organized by the institution have always been the general upliftment of the students. They are made to become aware of their social responsibilities, how to become better citizens of India and later, how to bring up their own children so that they are inculcated with the right values in life. Since the objectives of today's education system is more or less, the same, these activities undoubtedly integrate with and complement students' academic learning experience. The activities of the Committee of Community and Social Development and Environmental Awareness (already enumerated in previous questions) have certainly helped the students of

sociology in understanding their syllabus better. The Committee of Adult Education has conducted such programmes which have helped the students of Education. 'Matdata Jagrukta Abhiyan' has helped to give curricular support to the students of Political-Science. Several other such activities and programmes must have gone a long way to help the curricular understanding of the students. These activities contribute to inculcate in them a commitment and a strong sense of responsibility towards society on the whole and community to be specific. They develop an integrated personality and wholesome and comprehensive vision of 'Vasudhaiv Kutumbkam'. Their little gestures of concern towards the marginalized sections of society strengthen their bond of love, compassion and brotherhood towards the fellow-beings.

3.6.8. How does the institution ensure the involvement of the community in its reach out activities and contributed to the community development? Detail on the initiatives of the institution that encourage community participation in its activities.

Ans: Our institution is committed to community services through various extension activities. A Sakhi-Sansad was organized immediately after the shocking incident of Nirbhaya gang rape in Delhi on 6th December 2012. The parliament of students discussed and presented their views on the need of strict punishment like castration or death penalty for the perpetrators of such heinous crimes. Previously, a parliament of students was organized just before state assembly elections about the desired qualities in our leaders – 'Hamara neta kaisa ho'. Both these parliaments were organized in co-ordination with the NGO 'Sakhi Kendra'.

The institution has conducted several activities over the past several years which have benefitted the local community.

The Committee of Community and Social Development and Environmental Awareness was established in the college for creating awareness among students for working and extending support in favour of community welfare for the upliftment of people living in slums in pitiable conditions by developing knowledge about healthy and hygienic living conditions among them. The environmental issues are also a part of this committee. For this purpose, the committee makes efforts to develop environmental awareness among students and encourages them to educate the community around them on such issues like global warming, proper disposal of waste products, plantation of more trees, air-water-sound pollution etc. The members and students associated with the committee also educate these people about certain self-help skills like basket-knitting, candle-making etc. This helps them to earn their livelihood and also to augment their income.

On 29th August 2010, a college level competition was held on the topic 'Clean Kanpur-Green Kanpur' in the Department of Drawing and Painting initiated by Rotary Club. The same club had already organized an art competition on 12th August 2010 on the topic 'Save Water'.

The National Foundation for Communal Harmony (NFCH), New Delhi organized a Communal Harmony Campaign and a Fund Raising Week from 19th November 2010 to 25th November 2010. 25th November was also observed as the 'Flag Day'. The aim was to help the destitute children and specially those who had been the victims of communal riots, in every possible way. On 19th November, the committee also organized an essay

competition on communal harmony under the aegis of NFCH. On 20th November 2010, the committee organized a poster competition on issues related to community development. All through the years 2011 to 2014, various discussions and power-point presentations were organized on such issues like conservation of energy, sustainable development etc. In February 2012, a rally was organized to create environmental awareness among youths.

The Committee of Adult Education has also been working for the general upliftment of the communities living in surrounding areas. This committee particularly targets the welfare of the people living in 'Malin Bastis' and downtrodden areas. It not only facilitates their level of literacy but also develops their total human capacity and energy. Through this committee, the students not only hone their own skills towards various extension activities but also uplift, benefit and awaken the society to improve their quality of life. From August 2010 to February 2011, the students of B.A. III taught over 100 adults of nearby slums and the adopted 'Bastis'. They were also taught about environmental issues, personal cleanliness, health and hygiene, drug and alcoholism etc. The latent skills lying untapped within these men and women were also brought to fore. A one day health camp and two days environmental awareness exhibition was organized in 'Parao ki Basti' in February 2011. The programme of 'Each One-Teach One' was also highly successful. The annual meet of the committee was organized on 23rd February 2011 in which the students and adult literates were honoured by the Chief-guest Sri Salil Vishnoi (M.L.A.). In 2011-12, an adult education programme and poster competition on literacy and female foeticide was organized. In February 2012, a rally on literacy was organized by the joint efforts of Adult Education Committee and Committee for Community Development and Environmental Awareness.

The college also boasts of Health and Hygiene Committee which aims to create awareness among the students and the people of adjoining communities from which some of the college students' hail. On 30th November 2010, a programme "Raktdaan-Ek Jeevandaan" was organized by the committee in collaboration with District Tuberculosis Control Centre. The students were told about the importance of the donation of blood, need of purity of blood, causes of infection and various abnormalities existing in book. Quiz, slogan, poster and essay competitions on the topic were also organized.

On 10th February 2011, a district level essay competition was organized on the topic 'Female Foeticide' by IMA, Kanpur.

In collaboration with Kanpur Obstetrics and Gynae Society, named FOGSI, several debate, poster-presentation and slogan-writing competitions were organized on 21st September 2011 on the topic 'Female Foeticide-Social Perspective'. The Secretary of FOGSI, Dr. Usha Goenka delivered a lecture on 'Save the Girl Child'.

On 22nd January 2013, a lecture on 'Importance of Health and Hygiene in One's Life' was organized in collaboration with BNM Health Care Pvt. Ltd. Ms. Neelam Singh of this organization gave valuable suggestions to the students to keep fit and hygienically clean during the menstruation cycle.

On 1st March 2013, a free 'Eye Check-up Camp' was organized and Dr. P.J. Bansal, (M.S., Ophthalmology) examined the eye-sight of 400 students, teaching and non-teaching staff members of the college. The health camp and eye-check-up camps were open to the people living in the nearby areas of the institutions.

On 1st February 2014, the Health and Hygiene Committee of the college organized a one day free health check-up camp. In the camp, the doctors checked the health status of the students and gave away free medicines to them.

All these activities of the college have greatly benefitted the community which resides in areas around the college.

The institution has also involved the community in a number of its extension activities. The Committee of Health and Hygiene has organized several programmes and lectures by renowned doctors of the city for the benefit of the students.

The Committee of Civil Defence (A Voluntary Organization established in 1968 by the Parliament of India) has involved the community wherein the experts have contributed to train the students during such emergencies like natural calamities, accidents, wars, bomb-blasts etc. The personnels of civil defence have trained approximately 40 students in the year 2010-11. During the year 2011-12, approximately 50 students were trained. The personnels from Fire Department were invited to deliver lecture on the modes of defence at the time of fire.

The year 2012-13, which was also the golden jubilee year of Civil Defence, saw the training of approximately 100 students. They were also invited to participate in a mock-drill which gave valuable information about the ways of dealing with emergency situations.

In order to involve the community in the institutional development, the Parent-Teacher Association regularly invites the comments and suggestions of the parents for the betterment of the institution. Their comments have led to several works of infrastructural upgradation of the college. It was partly because of the suggestions of the parents that the college introduced the varied courses of U.P. Rajarshi Tandon Open University. On 11th December 2013, an interactive meet between the parents of the students and the staff of the college was organized by the Parent-Teacher Association to discuss the uses and abuses of mobile phones.

The college has also invited the services of the NGO – ‘Sakhi Kendra-Mahila Manch’ wherein the General Secretary of the NGO, Smt. Neelam Chaturvedi delivered lectures on women empowerment and techniques of self-defence. On 11th October 2011, a ‘Rakhi tying programme’ was organized by the joint efforts of ‘Sakhi Kendra’ and the college to curb the practice of eve-teasing. The same NGO has started ‘Mahila Helpline’ in the college wherein the problems and complaints of the students are looked into. The ‘Sakhi Kendra’ has also installed a complaint-box in the premises to look into the problems of the students.

On 29th December 2014, the NSS organized a programme on female foeticide to sensitize the people on the matter.

All these activities have led to the wide scale involvement of the community for the upliftment of the college.

3.6.9. Give details on the constructive relationship forged (if any) with other institutions of the locality for working on various outreach and extension activities.

- Vivekanand Youth Wing (an NGO) organized a seminar on the process of preparation for such competitive exams like Bank Clerk, PO, SSC, LDC, UDC. They also organized an examination to know the level of students’ preparation and selected 50 students from the

college for free classroom study for three months. This activity was organized by Guidance and Counselling Cell of the college.

- On 31st October 2012, Maya Academy of Advance Cinematics organized an awareness seminar for bachelor degree in animation which is affiliated to IGNOU.
- On 7th and 8th November 2012, Maya Academy of Advance Cinematics organized a Photoshop workshop for the students under the banner of Guidance and Counselling Cell.
- On 20th December 2012, Krishna Girls Engineering College / Krishna Institute of Technology organized a seminar on career awareness and personality development.
- On 23rd, 24th and 25th July, 2013, Franklin College of Management and Vocational Studies set up its canopy in college campus to tell the students about the courses like B.A. in Aviation, Hospitality, Travel, Tourism and Customer Service.
- On 30th August 2013, a career awareness programme about 'How to convert Education into Money' was organized by an NGO named Sanskar Society.
- On 10th September 2013, a workshop was organized by DXN at its outlet and the students of the college participated in it. The topic of the seminar was 'War Against Malnutrition' in which DXN consultant Mr. Hardeep Singh delivered a lecture about our food habits and food supplements.
- Jaipuria Institute of Management organized an awareness seminar about management studies. The delegates focused on management of communication skills and attitude for success.
- On 5th December 2013, a drawing competition and an awareness programme was organized by MAAC on the topics 'Environmental Awareness' and 'Female Infanticide' in which 75 students participated. MAAC Executive Mr. Surya supervised the whole event. Three best students were given gold, silver and bronze medals by the Company.
- On 18th February 2012, a lecture of Smt. Neelam Chaturvedi, General Secretary of the NGO 'Sakhi Kendra' and 'Mahila Manch' was organized in which Smt. Chaturvedi told the students about the various schemes, plans and policies of the Government to boost women entrepreneurship.
- On 19th April 2014, the NSS unit of the college participated in the poster competition sponsored by District Administrative on 'Matdata Jagrookta Shapath Rally'.
- The students of the college participated in a seminar 10th December 2014 on the topic HIV, AIDS organized by Ursula Hospital, Kanpur.
- On 8th August 2013, a 'Beti Bachao Rally' was organized by the prominent Newspaper 'Amar Ujala' in which the college students participated with their meaningful posters and slogans.
